
El Centro Range Fencing Project



The Flat-tailed horned lizard is the rarest horned lizard in North America. The Navy is committed to the conservation of this lizard while protecting our mission of providing realistic training to warfighters.

The United States Navy will be installing a fence along the corner of one of its bombing ranges to discourage off-highway vehicle incursions in the interest of public safety and to protect Flat-tailed horned lizard habitat as well as minimize training delays. Illegal crossings into the range area costs the Navy valuable training time.

The barrier is to be installed on Navy property immediately adjacent to the Superstition Mountain OHV Open Area near "The Dip."

The barrier will be constructed of three-strand smooth wire fencing with mounted perimeter warning signs to discourage illegal trespass into the Navy's bombing range.

Construction is anticipated to commence in early March 2021 with planned completion in late March 2021.

The Navy conducts routine active air-ground target practice within the area.

Unauthorized trespass negatively impacts the Navy's training mission.
